Call for Papers. The English-language section of the conference invites papers on the following topics:

- Intelligence and related fields of study (terrorism and counterterrorism, international security, and international relations);
- Artificial intelligence research and its applications in real-world contexts;
- Emotional intelligence and its role in emotional well-being, psychological safety, and workplace performance.

The reasons for this session were dictated by the interests of **undergraduate students** who strive to understand the rapidly developing fields of AI and EI, as well as the role Intelligence Agencies and International Relations have played with their concern in developing the technological advances of the age. These three fields of study are, for good reason, brought together under the umbrella of intelligence.

The goal of this session is to highlight the latest research and ideas, and to find the intersections between these three popular areas of study and interest. Thus, papers that focus on understanding how these areas of study intersect are of particular interest to the session, such as how artificial intelligence affects the expression, understanding, and management of emotions in diplomacy and other workplaces; how advances in technology and artificial intelligence can be inspired by the needs of intelligence agencies; or how individual or cultural factors facilitate or inhibit the transfer of EI skills.

We welcome submissions that include but are not limited to the topics specified above.
